
Welcoming Message

Broadway Corridor


The Broadway Corridor is a 32-acre site located within the Central City in Portland. The project offers the potential to create nearly 4 million square feet of new economic, business, social and community development opportunities.



Prosper Portland, the city's economic development agency, owns or controls a significant portion of the 32-acre site. The location and size of the Broadway Corridor represents an opportunity to realize Prosper Portland's vision for an equitable economy by advancing prosperity, creating a vibrant neighborhood and supporting living wage jobs.

The Broadway Corridor will permanently change Portland's downtown landscape and knit the city together. It's envisioned as a unique, diverse, vibrant, sustainable, mixed-use, urban district seamlessly integrated with a regional multi-modal transportation hub. The site is at the heart of a transportation network that includes light rail, pedestrian and bicycle connections, streetcar and bus, with multiple stops within a few blocks of the site, as well as Prosper Portland-owned Union Station. It will be the gateway to downtown Portland.

People, not buildings

Project leaders want to engage and partner with Portland residents to co-design the 32-acre site. Input and guidance from the community is absolutely crucial and necessary.

Many development projects have failed to benefit - or have negatively impacted longtime residents and community members, particularly low-income residents and communities of color. The Broadway Corridor will be different.

Through partnership with the Portland Housing Bureau, at least 30% of housing units will be "affordable" on this project.

Your presence in the decision-making process to create a more sustainable and equitable project that benefits you and your community.

Your participation in the process is critical to ensure this project is different.


